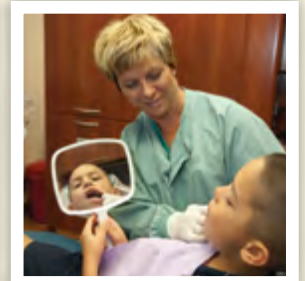
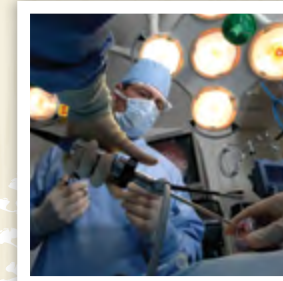
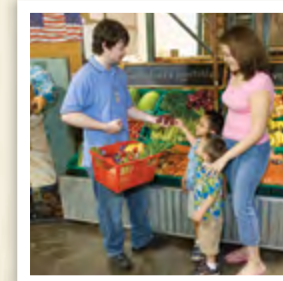

- Crisis prevention and counseling for at-risk youth.

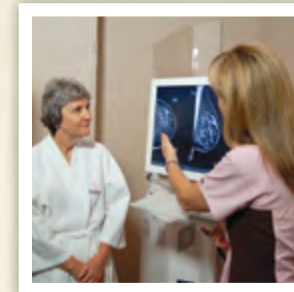
